WHERE IS THE CAMP LOCATED? Bongiorno Conference Center, 430 Union Hall Road, Carlisle, PA 17013.

WHAT ARE THE ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE TIMES? For Camps 1 + 3, Check-In opens Monday at 5:30pm and closes at 6:30pm. For Camps 2 + 4, Check-In opens Friday at 5:30pm and closes at 6:30pm. Please, no early arrivals! Please eat dinner before your arrival. For Camps 1 + 3, the first meal served is Breakfast on Tuesday. For Camps 2 + 4, the first meal is Breakfast on Saturday. All attendees must depart the campus by 9:30am the last day of each camp.

HOW IS MAIL SENT TO A CAMPER? Students love to get mail during CAMP! Our best recommendation is to send it with a leader coming to camp. You may send camp mail only to: Bongiorno Conference Center, 430 Union Hall Rd., Carlisle, PA 17013. You can also send e-mails for campers to malbanese@penndel.org. Please be sure to include the camper's full name, home church and city in your e-mail. (Disclaimer: Messages sent to this box have no implication or guarantee of privacy) All camper mail should be received by 8:00AM Thursday morning during the week of camp (Camps 2 + 4: Mail must be received by 8:00am Sunday) to ensure delivery to the camper.

HOW MUCH SPENDING MONEY WILL THE CAMPERS NEED? Campers may want to bring \$25-\$50 for extra spending money while at penndelyouth CAMP. This may be used for: snack bar, Camp Cafe, offering, merch, etc. Be sure to bring quarters if you plan to use the pop machine. (Also have your child bring bottled water in case the pop machine is out of order at any time.)

WHAT IS THE DRESS CODE? Dress for all campers is casual. For guys and girls, modest length shorts or loose-fitting pants are permitted. Appropriate footwear must be worn at all times. Guys and girls should be modestly dressed. Girls' swimsuits must be a modest one-piece and guys must wear boxer-style swim shorts.

WHAT ARE THE RULES AND REGULATIONS? Specific rules will be given on the first day of camp. Each camper must understand that lack of cooperation, unnecessary roughness, lack of respect for property, or an unwholesome attitude on the part of any camper will result in expulsion from camp. Expense of transporting expelled campers will be the responsibility of the parents.

WHAT SHOULD CAMPERS BRING? Bible, pen/pencil, notebook, bedding, pillow, towels, shower supplies, toiletries, bottled water, old tennis shoes & clothes for mud pit, sleepwear and bathing suit (girls: modest one-piece; guys: boxer-type swim shorts). Campers may want to bring musical instruments or sound tracks for service auditions. Neither the Bongiorno Conference Center nor PennDel Youth Network will be held responsible for lost or stolen items.

WHAT SHOULD CAMPERS NOT BRING? Campers may NOT bring any of the following items to youth camp: valuable items, skateboards/roller-skates, illicit materials, knives, cigarettes/tobacco products, drugs, alcohol, fireworks, firearms, candles, etc. All such items will be confiscated.

CELL PHONES: We strongly discourage the use of cell phones for students. This will allow a student to fully immerse in the camp experience. PDYN and BCC are not responsible for lost, stolen or broken items.

ARE VISITORS PERMITTED? Camp is a closed event. We do not allow visitors on the BCC grounds from the beginning of Camp, until its conclusion. In the past, we have allowed our Wednesday night service to be open for church groups and visitors. However, beginning Camp 2024, visitation is unaccepted and discouraged. Persons who find it necessary to visit are requested to e-mail hdunston@penndel.org at least 24 hours in advance and avoid interfering with the camp program.

CHAPERONES: It is the responsibility of each group registering to provide adequate chaperones for their students. Each group MUST register one male/female chaperone, at least 20 yrs. old, for every 1-10 male/female students they register.
